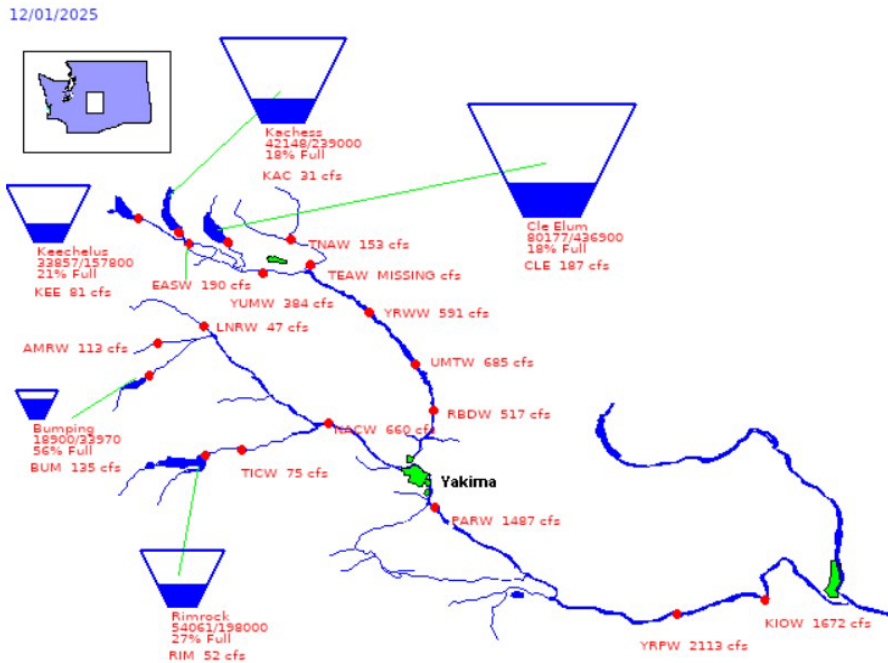


YBSA Monthly Report November 2025

Storage: The current capacity of the five storage reservoirs is a 21%. Storage is currently twice as much as last year at this time, but it is less than one-half as much as the historical average.

Lake Keechelus, located in the headwaters of the Yakima River, is at its lowest level in years. The snowpack on the east side of the Cascades Mountains, on the pass where Snoqualmie Pass is located, is less than a foot of snow. Lake Cle Elum is so low that the old structure of a sawmill is visible. This is the start of the winter months; we should all pray for a long season of mountain snowfall.
